

Recently, there have been frequent disasters caused by typhoons, heavy rain, and “guerrilla downpours” – sudden, intense bursts of heavy rain over a short period.

Nagano City also suffered extensive damage from the 2019 East Japan Typhoon disaster.

Let’s prepare in advance for typhoons and heavy rains.



When a typhoon approaches, strong winds can cause objects to fly about.

Before a typhoon approaches, you should bring any items at risk of flying away inside.

In addition, heavy rain can sometimes cause river water to overflow.

It is dangerous to try to escape once the road is no longer visible due to water; therefore, if you sense danger or receive instructions to evacuate via television or smartphone, please evacuate immediately.

If you are too late to evacuate but can reach a safe location inside the house – such as the second floor – stay indoors.

River water may enter your house, so please store important items such as money, clothes, and bedding in a high place, such as on the second floor.

You can check the areas that will be inundated in the case of a river overflow by looking at the city’s hazard map.

Check how prone your home, workplace, and frequently visited locations are to flooding. For information regarding disasters in Nagano City, please visit the “Nagano City Disaster Prevention Information Portal.”

When a disaster is imminent or has occurred, please pay close attention to alerts and take action to protect your life, such as evacuating quickly.
